## Analysis of Speed Indicator Device (SID) data for September 2022

The SID was located on Bluntisham Road just outside the "Colne" sign, facing towards Bluntisham, for 16 days between September $2^{\text {nd }} \&$ September $18^{\text {th }}$ 2022. (The SID collects data not only from approaching vehicles but also from those departing in the opposite direction; in the case of departing vehicles the speed is not displayed to the driver.)

Over the 14 day period, just over one-third (35\%) of all vehicles were recorded as exceeding the 30 mph speed limit. The average speed was 29 mph with $15 \%$ of vehicles travelling in excess of 34 mph .

## Vehicles approaching from Bluntisham

$36 \%$ of vehicles were recorded as travelling in excess of the 30 mph limit with almost one in six (15\%) recorded travelling at a speed greater than 34 mph . The average speed was 29 mph .

These figures show an improvement on those recorded in May 2022 at the same location when 38\% of vehicles were recorded as exceeding the limit. The average speed then was also 29 mph .

The diagram, below, shows the distribution of vehicle speeds arriving from Bluntisham:


## Vehicles departing towards Bluntisham

(The speed of vehicles travelling in this direction is not displayed to the driver and so the presence of the SID is likely to be less of a deterrent.)

Over one-third (35\%) of all vehicles were travelling in excess of the 30 mph limit with almost one in six exceeding 34 mph . The average speed was 28 mph .

These figures show a significant improvement over those of May 2022, with speed violations reducing from $39.8 \%$ to this month's $35 \%$. The average speed has come down from 29 mph to 28 mph .
